A gathering prayer

Bible Reading: John 17:1-11 (NRSV)

Jesus prays for his disciples

After Jesus had spoken these words, he looked up to heaven and said, "Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son so that the Son may glorify you, since you have given him authority over all people, to give eternal life to all whom you have given him. And this is eternal life, that they may know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent. I glorified you on earth by finishing the work that you gave me to do. So now, Father, glorify me in your own presence with the glory that I had in your presence before the world existed.

"I have made your name known to those whom you gave me from the world. They were yours, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they know that everything you have given me is from you; for the words that you gave to me I have given to them, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me. I am asking on their behalf; I am not asking on behalf of the world, but on behalf of those whom you gave me, because they are yours. All mine are yours, and yours are mine; and I have been glorified in them. And now I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one."

Reflection

Jesus' farewell speech draws to a close with a prayer for his beloved disciples, that is for those gathered around him in that quiet room before his soon coming death and also, for all of us who follow him today. Jesus brings the new community of believers, a community created as a direct result of his work of revealing God to them, before God in prayer. It is a beautiful prayer, isn't it? The words of this prayer remind us of the opening words of John's Gospel and they disclose the great depth of Jesus' love and care for his followers in what is often a harsh and unwelcoming world for people of faith. As we saw last week, Jesus promised them the gift of an Advocate, an Intercessor, a Comforter in the sending of the Spirit. Now, he prays that they will also have the wonderful gift of 'eternal life'; this precious gift not so much about a gift of immortality and a future life in heaven as is traditionally thought, rather it speaks to us about our life right now being shaped and sustained by the knowledge of God as revealed to us by Jesus Christ. Throughout this prayer, we see that these deeply loved disciples belong to God, and Jesus entrusts them, and us today, to God's loving care and draws them, and us today, into a glorious life filled with the knowledge of God.

We reflect further on this glory that Jesus hopes we'll now share in. In this prayer, Jesus prays fully aware that his 'hour has come'. 'Glorify' here refers to him making visible the presence of God. Jesus prays that the events of his soon coming dark and difficult hour will complete his revelation of God. This is quite a different view of glory compared to the 'dazzling light' type of glory that usually comes to mind! We see also that Jesus says that he has been glorified in his disciples and we in turn, in this our time seek to live a 'God aware', 'God-orientated' life that bring him glory. Such a life includes our knowing and understanding God and yet I believe it also provokes us to think about how we live in unity as a Christian community and how we act as disciples today. Perhaps in seeking to glorify God, like Jesus, we also aim at 'finishing the work' that God has given us to do here 'on earth'. And what might our God-ordained work be? Well, if I may, here are just a few examples:

- Show mercy, justice and humility before God (Micah 6:8)

- Share the gospel of love and draw others into a life of discipleship (Matthew 28:19-20)

- Care for those who are in need around us (James 1:27)

- Do good and share with others (Hebrews 13:16)

As we seek to live a God glorifying life in ways like these, may we know and experience the strengthening and sustaining presence of the glorious God at work in our lives. Amen.
