Bible Reading. Colossians 3 vs 12-17.

Reflection

We as individuals need to show Jesus to others in the coming New Year and what He means to us, our communities and others. 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I mentioned that Joseph was warned in a dream about the dangers Herod posed. He, Mary, Jesus, the Wise men, they showed courage. As we respond to the Christmas message, even if we are finding life difficult and uncomfortable, we, too, need courage. In our lives, in the coming year we will face the inevitabilities of life - accidents, heartache, bad health, even death - these are stark, grim facts of human experience. Society is, at times, chaotic and even evil, violent and hateful. These facts seem to negate life. It is then when we need to show courage and an inner resolution to go forward. As Christians we must never lose that zest for life based on Jesus' teaching. So, we need Vision; we need Courage.

We also need Humility. Consider the birth of Jesus and how God worked through ordinary, humble surroundings concerning the Christmas story. A great drama of God's rescue plan for mankind, was played out in an ordinary village, a stable with a peasant family being visited by tough, outspoken shepherds. God chose ordinary lives.

Who knows what God is currently doing in our ordinary lives? - we must be humble and reach out to our communities to show that something special happened on Christmas Day; we have something special to say that kindness, care, fairness, justice and love are the bedrock qualities to us as Christians.

Above all the qualities of Vision, Courage, Humility, we must show Love. In our personal lives, a kind word, a smile, a word of encouragement. a charitable deed. We need to be filled with the Holy Spirit which speaks out in all we do.

A light came into our world at Christmas. We must now put that Christian message into action by moving forward with Vision, Courage, Humility and Christian Love.
