The Lamb of God

29 The next day he saw Jesus coming towards him and declared, 'Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!' **30** This is he of whom I said, "After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me." **31** I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel.' **32** And John testified, 'I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. **33** I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, "He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit." **34** And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God.'

The First Disciples of Jesus

³⁵ The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, ³⁶ and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, 'Look, here is the Lamb of God!' ³⁷ The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. ³⁸ When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, 'What are you looking for?' They said to him, 'Rabbi' (which translated means Teacher), 'where are you staying?' ³⁹ He said to them, 'Come and see.' They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon. ⁴⁰ One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. ⁴¹ He first found his brother Simon and said to him, 'We have found the Messiah' (which is translated Anointed). ⁴² He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, 'You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Cephas' (which is translated Peter).

Our prayers of intercession

Lord, in the stillness of this moment, help us to think back over this past week and ponder: Where have you revealed yourself to us this week? In nature around us? In the smile of a friend or family member? The kindness of strangers? Through your word? If this week has seemed dark and difficult, point us to a lighter moment that we perhaps didn't notice at first. Help us to cling onto the truth that, whether we noticed you or not, you were there and always will be beside us.

L: Lord, reveal yourself to us

All: That we may show you to others.

Lord, as we turn our thoughts to the world, we see so much turmoil and unrest. We see wars and rumours of wars. We pray for the situation in Iran. We continue to lift Gaza, Israel and Ukraine to you.

Lord, in our world we also see untold sorrow. We see distrust and confusion. Yet we know that you are Lord of all. We know that one day all kings and rulers will bow down before you. We pray for our leaders now, Lord... Show yourself to them in 2026, we pray. Astonish them by your presence. Give them wisdom, particularly where there are difficult decisions to be made about the welfare of the people they serve. Help them, and us, to be bringers of peace.

L: Lord, reveal yourself to us

All: That we may show you to others.

Lord, we pray for those in our community who need fresh vision of who you are just now. We remember those who are in pain, sickness or sorrow, especially...

Lord, be their comfort and healer in ways they could not previously have imagined. Enable us to be there for them, with a word of encouragement, a loving arm around the shoulder, practical action, whatever they need. Show us new ways to be your eyes, your feet, your hands.

We pray for our health services, social services and all those who provide community care, especially....

Help us always to be supportive of those who support us, in whatever way.

L: Lord, reveal yourself to us

All: That we may show you to others.

Lord, we pray for the places around us where there seems to be darkness instead of your light... We pray for people who feel enmeshed in the darkness of addiction, trauma or depression... Show us where and how we can be light bringers. May your kingdom come. Reveal yourself in the small things, giving people the hope they need to keep going even when all seems difficult or dark. Reveal yourself in the big things, giving flashes of inspiration and joyful moments. May this year bring transformation, hope and light.

L: Lord, reveal yourself to us

All: That we may show you to others.

Lord, we focus now on the week ahead. We picture the places we expect to be going to and the people we expect to meet. Help us to bring your love into each situation. We pray particularly about any moments that may be difficult or uncomfortable. Help us to know that you are walking alongside us and give us your peace. Enable us to be surprised by you this week, too, Lord - not so hooked on our routines that we aren't able to make space for the unexpected. Help us to see where you are within those moments and to follow where you lead. Bring us back here next week with a renewed sense of purpose and joy.

All: That we may show you to others.

And send us out from here with a willingness to be your hands and feet, your followers and disciples, bearing your love into every corner of our community. **Amen.**
